## FR. PAT WRITES OUR CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

*Dear Parishioners & Friends of Rathmore Parish*

### What are you getting for Christmas?

Over the past few days I have been traveling around to the sick and the housebound. These are regular visits, but at this time of year there is a wonderful freshness and warmth about them. Usually the person is sitting by the fireside, and all that is required for the day is within hands reach. You can see that the energy that was there in earlier life has receded a little so the circle of activity has become smaller.

However, that circle enlarges again in preparation for Christmas ... the tree is put up, candles on the windows, and the crib holding a special place of honour. That Nativity Scene changes the atmosphere, people have a great sense of not being alone "sure hasn't the holy family moved in"! This year in particular brought one parishioner new energy and when I heard her story it brought a tear to my eye, and fresh perspective as to what is really important in life. It reminded me too that the Spirit of Christmas (which she has in abundance); is a Spirit of Hope, a Spirit of Joy.

Here is her little story and I hope she won't mind me sharing it with you:

*"What's the plan for Christmas"? I asked. "Father I've started already, this year I decided to give myself a treat. I can't travel by car anymore, but I discovered that there are Taxis in Killarney that can take wheelchairs; so I ordered one and he came out and brought me to Killarney".*

*"What did you do in Killarney"? , I asked.*

*"I went in to see the Christmas Lights Fr. It has been eleven years since I was in Killarney, there were lovely red bulbs there back then; but my O my, the ones they have now are absolutely wonderful. The driver was a lovely man, he took me around the town a few times .... he showed me the statue of Mgr. Hugh O Flaherty.*

The gifts we bring to others are a special part of Christmas but that driver gave our friend a real treasure ... the gift of his time, sometimes that is all that is needed.

### THE CHRIST CHILD BEING BORN IN US TODAY

Christmas brings us all back to the crib of life to start over:

aware of what has gone before, conscious that nothing can last, but full of **HOPE** that this time, finally, we can learn what it takes to live well, grow to full stature of soul and spirit, get it right.
