CEMETERY MASS REMEMBRANCE STONES

This year you are invited to bring a stone to be used as a 'prayer stone' to the Cemetery Masses in the parish and we will create a cairn of stones. ... to honour our prayerful gathering.

Cairns are a group of monuments constructed for a ritual or social gathering. There are just over 400 of them in Ireland, and they are almost all found north of a line between Galway Bay and Dublin, i.e. in the northern half of the country. There is also a Jewish custom of leaving stones on the grave to mark a visit to remember a loved one.

Please inform people outside Parish who may have relatives buried in any of the aforementioned of dates and time. It is greatly appreciated that all our graveyards are kept tidy.

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH - THE HOLY TRINITY
