This week's gospel focuses on the importance of being present and never losing sight of the kingdom of God. Jesus explained this through the parable of the wise and the foolish bridesmaids. The wise bridesmaids were prepared, making sure they had enough oil for their lamps. The foolish bridesmaids on the other hand, were not prepared and expected others to come to their aid when their oil ran out.

We should strive to do our best. No one can realise or fulfil their full human potential if they are lazy. We cannot expect others to always come to our aid when we haven't prepared properly. Think of the washing that is left for others, the bedrooms that are left in chaos and the times when we don't bother because we know someone else will sort things out. We should always be alert and awake, and we should always carry our own load. Despite the fact that the sun always rises tomorrow, it's important to be present at any given moment and to prepare adequately for the future in the now. Life's distractions can often cause us to lose sight of the kingdom of God, and this week's gospel is a reminder to live each and every day with the ultimate goal in mind.
