WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES: Pope Francis' Itinerary for his visit to the World Meeting of Families has been confirmed. Regarding Tickets for the Final Mass in the Phoenix Park, these will be available online from **Monday 25th June** www.worldmeeting2018.ie

Ticketing is a two-step process: 1. Registration (opening Monday 25th June) 2. Print tickets at a later date. This is available to parishes / individuals.

- It is a free event.
 - Involves 3-5km walk EACH WAY due to the transport routes in place for this event.
- Festival of Families in Croke Park - Saturday 25th August Pope Francis will be in attendance. This is an evening concert of music and dance, celebrating family life across the world and including five families who will share their faith. Photo identification + ticket will be required to access the venue.

To guarantee your ticket for either event that is the Festival of Families or the Final Mass you could register for one of the days at the RDS Congress at a cost of €38 per day at
