IN THE RUN-UP TO CONFIRMATION: THE FOLLOWING IS AN INTERESTING ARTICLE WRITTEN BY FR. CHRIS HAYDEN, EDITOR, INTERCOM MAGAZINE, ADDRESSED TO CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES

Your big day is getting close. In a short time, you'll be confirmed. But I can tell you now that after you've been confirmed you won't look any different, and - once the big day is behind you – you won't feel any different either. So, what difference will being confirmed make?

Here's a story that might help you to think a bit about that question. An Indian chief was speaking to his grandchildren. He said to them: *My dearest boys and girls, inside each and every one of us, there are two wolves, a good wolf and a wicked wolf, and they are locked in mortal combat.* Several hands went up, as the children asked: Grandfather, which of the wolves wins the combat? The wise chief answered: *The wolf you feed the most; that's the wolf that will win.* That little story tells us something about how the sacrament of confirmation works; about the difference it makes.

God's Holy Spirit will help you, but won't do all the work for you. To use the image of the story (and it's only an image!): you will have to "feed the good wolf". It will be up to you to live a good life, a life of kindness, of courage, of faith. The Holy Spirit *will* be given to you in a new way – but the choices will still be yours. Make no mistake, if you want to live a good life, a noble life, a life of truth and dignity, you will, at times, find yourselves in combat. God gives you everything you need, so which side will win? The side you feed the most!

Valentine's Day card or instead give words of love and encouragement to the special people in your life - today.

If with pleasure you are viewing any work that I am doing, If you like me or you love me, tell me now.

Don't withhold your admiration, till God makes oration, and I lie with snowy lilies o'er my brow.

For no matter how you shouted, I won't care much about it;

I won't see how many tears you have shed. If you think some praise is due me, now is the time to slip it to me. For I cannot read my headstone when I am dead.

More than fame and more than money, is the comment warm and sunny,

Is the hearty warm approval of a friend, for it gives a life a savour.

And it makes me stronger, braver, and it gives me spirit right up to the end.

If I earn your praise, bestow it. If you like me, let me know it. Let the words of true encouragement be said, Don't wait till life is over and I'm underneath the clover, For I cannot read my headstone when I'm dead.
