We have decided to stream all Masses during the present lockdown from St. Joseph's Church Rathmore because people find it easier to access MCN media.



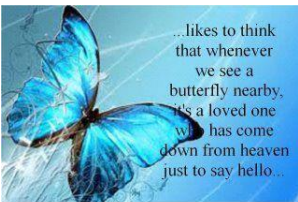
