COVID-19 – UPDATE

The new Covid regulations took effect on December 31st, 2020 and remain in place until January 31st, 2021.

These regulations have the following implications for religious services, funerals, and weddings.

Public worship may take place only online or through the use of remote means.

Funerals are restricted to no more than 10 people, excluding the priest. <u>Guards of Honour should not form or congregate on church grounds</u>

Weddings are restricted to no more than 6 people, excluding the priest and also excluding the couple getting married **Baptisms:** Save for cases of emergency, baptisms are postponed until further notice.

Church Opening: Churches remain open for private worship.

House visits/First Friday visits should not take place save for cases of emergency or where it is necessary to minister to the sick or dying.

CHURCHES All those attending church for private worship or for the purposes of cleaning the church must wear face masks or face coverings.

Parish Offices are to remain closed to the public. Any query please phone, leave a message and we will get back to you. There will be no collection service for mass cards.
