## Parishioner Tax Rebate Scheme.

Parishioners who are eligible to participate in the Parishioner Tax Rebate Scheme should have either received their invitation or renewal letter now.

COVID-19 created severe difficulties for the management of our Parish finances in 2021, given that we have had no Offertory Collection for the first five months of the year.

That's what makes your response so crucial. The money we get from the Tax Rebate is vitally important.

In 2019 it brought in  $\notin$  21,488 and  $\notin$  19,627 in 2020. Were it not for this income in 2020 Parish finances would have ended the year in the red.
