#### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

Following the Government announcement concerning the further easing of public health restrictions made on October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 the following is the position in relation to religious services: -

• Religious services and weddings can proceed without capacity limits but with all other protective measures remaining in place as and from Friday October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021.

All existing protective measures remain in place, and this includes, but is not limited, to the following: -

- Public health signage must remain in place reminding people to observe social distancing, to wear face masks, and to follow good respiratory hygiene and cough etiquette.
- Face masks are to be worn at all religious services.
- Hand sanitisers are required at all church entrance and exit points.
- Water fonts should not be used until further notice.
- Social distancing must be followed, for example, a one way/staggered system for the distribution of Holy Communion and a staggered exit from the church at the end of Mass.
- The passing of collection baskets between members of the congregation should be avoided. Alternative
  measures should be used, such as collection facilities at church entrance and exit points, the use of long
  handled collection baskets, and the use of online facilities.
- The physical act of making the sign of peace should be avoided. An alternative act should be used such as a nod, a wave, or some other form of acknowledgement.
- Holy Communion should only be received in the hand. The reception of Holy Communion on the tongue should be avoided.
- Face masks must be worn by all those involved in the distribution of Holy Communion.
- A management plan must be in place for the distribution of Holy Communion. Communion Stations should remain in place and a one way system or staggered system should be in operation for the distribution of Holy Communion.
- The return of a full choir or folk group should be avoided. Small groups of singers can perform subject to all protective measures.
- Ushers will be required to ensure compliance with existing protective measures, to assist people on entering and leaving the church and to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion.

The dispensation from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy days of obligation remains in place until further notice. However, we would strongly encourage parishioners to return to Mass on Sundays or on the Saturday evening Vigil Mass.
