Reflect Machnamh "Dear brother, dear sister: if on this night you are experiencing an hour of darkness, a day that has not yet dawned, a light dimmed or a dream shattered, open your heart with amazement to the message of Easter: "Do not be afraid, he has risen!"

Pray Guigh Loving Jesus, as the mist tiptoes over the hill, may your compassion tiptoe deep within me. Treading softly through the hardened pathways of my heart and life, open me with the gentle touch of your grace, to start afresh this day. **Amen**

Monday (SUSTAINED BY LOVE)

Invitation Cuireadh We can cope with anything that life throws at us, if we have love in our lives - a loving partner or a true friend or the support of community. Loving others needs sustenance, or we won't last the journey. Jesus invites us to draw from the well of God's love, who has carved each of us on the palm of his hand.

Reflect Machnamh I think most people are called to marriage because we need at least one other person to be like a mirror for us, to reflect our best self - and our worst self - in a way that we can receive. The interesting thing about a mirror is that it doesn't change the image; it simply takes it in as it is.

Our closest friends or life partner hold a mirror/up to us, revealing our good side and our dark side and reminding us that we still haven't really learned to love. That's what every healthy relationship does. When we fall in love, we fall into an infinite mystery. That's why Jesus gave what was symbolically an infinite number, "seventy times seven" (Matthew 18:22), as the number of times even good people will need to forgive each other. Richard Rohr OFM

Tuesday (SOWING SEEDS OF HOPE)

Reflect Machnamh Everything exists because God called it into being by name. Wednesday (EMBRACING LIFE)

Invitation Cuireadh: Our life is a gift received from God. We are living, but are we alive? To embrace someone or something is to hold them close, to give oneself wholeheartedly, without reserve.

Becoming alive is giving ourselves freely to all that life brings our way - it is receiving the joy, the sadness, the ups and the downs - trusting that Jesus walks with us. Are we embracing the gift of life?

Reflect Machnamh: Meister Eckhart tells us that the reason we do not bear fruit IS that we do not let go and let be, we do not trust ourselves or God. It is only when we trust that we can love. And if we do trust, then God can accomplish great things through us and in us.
