Trocaire Lent 2022

Food Shortage and Scarcity – Courage, Hope and Strength Needed



This Lent, we hear about how communities who were already facing huge challenges due to drought and food shortages, caused by climate change, were further impacted by Covid-19.

This is seen in how Covid-19 impacted people's livelihoods and access to education and food security. We here in Ireland are also very familiar with the impact of Covid-19. We will learn more about the impact of the pandemic through the story of Thandekile and her two children, No matter and Forward, who live in Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwe, officially the Republic of Zimbabwe, is a landlocked country located in south-east Africa, between the Zambezi and Limpopo rivers. It is bordered by South Africa to the south, Botswana to the south-west, Zambia to the north, and Mozambique to the east. The capital and largest city is Harare.

The Covid-19 pandemic has increased food insecurity and shortages. In 2020, 75 per cent of rural households faced moderate to severe food scarcity, compared to 42 per cent in 2019. The closure of borders to South Africa and Botswana has had a negative impact on remittances (the money sent back to families from relatives working in another country) and resulted in job losses. Zimbabwe was once regarded as the great hope for Africa. But its enormous potential has been restricted by a series of climate-related and economic crises, compounded by political instability and Covid-19.

With your support, Trócaire, through our partner organisations, works with marginalised communities living in poverty in Zimbabwe. We work with rural communities to help improve food production. We also work with women to protect them from violence and encourage them to have a stronger voice. Our partners also work with human rights defenders who hold the government of Zimbabwe to account. Trócaire has worked with local partners in Zimbabwe since the country became independent in 1980.
