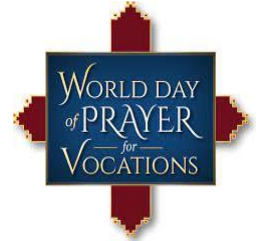


### OUR PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

**Duhallow/Sliabh Luachra Synodal Listening Evening (Rathmore)  
continued Questions from the Synodal Pathway Meeting.**

**Q3. Can you identify within your parish, groups of people who may not feel included and listened to?**

1. Young people should be involved more (young to middle aged). Need encouragement to take part.
2. Travellers would not feel included as they don't feel included in most parts of society.
3. Disabled people. Probably can't always access church.
4. Disadvantaged or poor people. We cannot always see this.
5. Newcomers may not always feel welcome.
6. People with neuro diverse children don't always feel welcome. Children can have behavioural issues not always understood by congregations.
8. People in second unions, gay community, e.g. can't receive communion)
8. Women subservient role.

**Q4. What obstacles or difficulties do you feel exist within your parish that might lead to people feeling excluded or marginalised?**

1. Top-down organisation.
2. Parish Priest has the veto.
3. The Church in the past wielded a lot of power. Even though that is no longer the case some people believe is still so.
5. The Church's stance on abortion and divorce are possibly making people feel excluded.
6. Gay, trans people feel excluded in society and so certainly feel excluded by the Church. Everybody were created by God and it is up to us to be tolerant.
