OUR POSTURE AT MASS

STANDING: In daily life we stand to greet people, to honour someone of importance and to express readiness for action. As Christians, we do the same in Mass as we welcome the risen Lord in our midst.

Thus we stand at various parts of the Mass including the Introductory Rites, the Gospel and finally for the concluding rites as we show our readiness to go out and live what we have prayed.

SITTING: We sit to listen, to rest and to watch. Within the Mass it is appropriate then to sit during the readings prior to the Gospel as we listen to the Lord who is our teacher.

We sit for the homily as the priest applies these words to our lives. We may also choose to sit or kneel as we observe a time of sacred silence after receiving Holy Communion

KNEELING: In the early Church kneeling signified penitence. In the Middle ages it came to signify homage. More recently, kneeling has come to signify humble adoration.

It is for this reason that it is appropriate for the congregation to kneel for the consecration during the Eucharistic prayer –that is from after the "Holy, Holy" until after the "Amen" that concludes the Doxology
