Mass in the 'City' this Sunday at 1.30pm

The following is taken from a Kerryman article of May 7th 1982

FOR ages back people have come to "The City"—The City of Kerry's Kingdom—on May Day and, each succeeding day up to May 12, which was Old May Day, to pay 'rounds' and to bring home with them water from the holy well. This year was no exception, and since early on Saturday morning! last pilgrims have been winding their way up the steep and winding hillside track to the Penitential Station, Cromlech' Cathair Craobh Dearg, at the foothills of the Paps Mountains, south of Rathmore.

From all over Cork and Kerry—indeed from places much further afield, pilgrims come to the "City" during the first two weeks- of May. Here they kneel and pray on the green sward, atop this majestic mound, partake of the waters from the holy well, and pay 'rounds' at this hallowed spot, just as their forefathers have done, year after, year since time immemorial. For centuries the "City" has been sanctified by tire prayers of throngs of pious Irish worshippers..

The late Fr. William Ferris had Mass" celebrated at' the "City" on May morning 1925. Following the ceremony, Fr. Ferris, who was then CC in Rathmore, and an eminent historian, gave a lengthy talk which is on, record to the vast crowd present. During his disclosure he quoted from O'Curry's Manuscripts, telling the beautiful story of Finn MacCools visit to the place. He told'of. the "City being the residence of ancient Irish Kings, in days long gone by and said that the "City's" Festival, on May Day had been celebrated —without a break—for seventy centuries. Through paganism, druidism and otherwise it had several setbacks; yet the annual Festival never ceased. This recorded talk, given by Fr. Ferris, on that May morning fifty-seven years ago, certainly makes incresting reading.

The following is taken from a Kerryman article of August 9th 1985

The Festival of May, the" Gaelic Bealtaine, is still observed at Cathair Craobh Dearg, where on May Day and during the twelve succeeding days -because of the change to the Gregorian-Calendar which made May . 1st, -May 12th - pilgrims from near and far come to pray to, and to honour Mary, the Mother of God.

Some years ago, a local voluntary body had a statue of Our Lady of the Wayside erected, at a. point adjacent to the megalithic altar. In 1983, Canon Patrick Doherty P.P., Rathmore, assisted by Rev. James Kissane, C.C., had Mass celebrated at The City on May Day, and vast throngs attended the ceremony. It was afterwards decided to have Mass celebrated at The City on the first. Sunday in May of each year, 'so this year will be the third successive year to have the Festival honoured with the celebration of Mass.
