# Mass on Token Fire Mountain Friday June 20<sup>th</sup> @ 7.30pm

There are two solstices every year: one in June and one in December. The June solstice marks the longest day north of the equator and the shortest day in the south.

The June solstice is the moment the Sun is directly above the Tropic of Cancer in the Northern Hemisphere. This is the northernmost latitude it reaches during the year. After the solstice, it begins moving south again.

Since the Northern Hemisphere is tilted toward the Sun in June, it receives more sunlight during the course of a day. The North Pole's tilt toward the Sun is greatest at the solstice, so this event marks the longest day of the year north of the equator. Places within the Arctic Circle experience Midnight Sun or polar day, when the Sun does not set at night.

## Why Is It Called a "Solstice?"

During a year, the subsolar point—the spot on the Earth's surface directly beneath the Sun—slowly moves along a northsouth axis. Having reached its southernmost point at the December solstice, it stops and starts moving northward until it crosses the equator on the day of the March equinox. At the June solstice, which marks the northernmost point of its journey, it stops again to start its journey back toward the south.

This is how the solstices got their name: the term comes from the Latin words sol and sistere, meaning "Sun" and "to stand still".

## **Celtic Traditions:**

- Lighting and jumping over bonfires on Midsummer's Eve dates back to pre-Christian pagan customs. It was thought to keep demons away and bring good luck to lovers.
- After the Christian Church was established, solstice celebrations were combined with St John's Day, commemorating St John the Baptist.
