Welcoming June

As we begin the month of June we come to the End of the Easters Season, and begin the Season of Ordinary Time. Having worn white vestments throughout Easter, the Priest will wear Green Vestments in this Season'

But, there is nothing 'ordinary' or commonplace about Ordinary Time! It is so called because this is the ordered time – outside the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter – when Sundays are counted (using ordinal numbers). Ordinary Time is divided into two periods: between the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of Lent, and between Pentecost and the beginning of Advent. It is the longest season of the church year.

Whereas Christmas celebrates the coming of Christ, and Holy Week and the Easter season celebrate the Paschal Mystery (his Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension), the Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects, taking us through his life, ministry, teaching, healing and other miracles.

In this season we are encouraged to grow and mature in daily expression of our faith.
