Have You Money or Are You Rich?

In the musical 'Filddler on the Roof' the main character, Tevye, daydreams about how his life would be different if he was wealthy.

[TEVYE, spoken] Oh dear Lord, you made many, many poor people. I realize, of course, that it's no shame to be poor. But it's no great honor either. So what would have been so terrible if I had a small fortune?

In this Sundays Gospel, Jesus tells about the man who stores up earthly wealth but is called a fool by God, for he dies before he can enjoy it. The lesson is clear: having money does not mean we are truly rich.

(sung) If I were a rich man
Ya ba dibba dum
All day long I'd biddy biddy bum
If I were a wealthy man
I wouldn't have to work hard
Ya ba dibba dibba dibba dibba dibba dum
If I were a biddy biddy rich
Idle-diddle-didle-didle man.

We live in a world where wealth is measured in Euros, square footage, cars, or investments. But Jesus challenges that thinking.

The real question is: **Are we rich in what matters to God?**

A successful executive with luxury homes and a private jet recently shared in an interview, "I have everything I dreamed of, but I'm constantly anxious and disconnected. I built my wealth but lost my family." Money without love is not richness.

In contrast, a woman working two jobs to support her children shared a story of offering her only umbrella to a stranger during a rainstorm. "I have little, but I have enough to share," she said. Generosity is a form of spiritual wealth.

A group of second level pupils spent their summer holidays volunteering at a food bank instead of going on a trip. "We wanted to do something that would matter," one said. Compassion builds eternal treasure.

There once was a man who decided to start jogging to improve his wellbeing. On his first day out, he ran just a few blocks before he was completely out of breath. Gasping for air, he stopped, looked up to the sky, and prayed:

"Lord, I don't know how long I'm going to keep this up, but please bless me with the strength to run a little farther tomorrow."

The next day, he ran a little farther, but again struggled. At the end, he prayed the same prayer, with one small change:

"Lord, if you could just help me survive the next run without collapsing, I'd be grateful."

Weeks went by, and he kept running, praying, and sometimes wheezing. One day, he finally reached the end of his route without stopping! Overjoyed, he looked up and said:

"Thank you, Lord! Now, could you please bless me with the strength to walk back home?"

Moral: Wellbeing is a journey filled with ups and downs. Sometimes the best prayer is simply asking God to help us keep going — even if that means taking it one step at a time!

Lord, teach me to value what truly lasts. Help me to be rich in kindness, patience, and faith. May I store up treasures in heaven by living with open hands and a faithful heart. Amen
