Lay people to take up leadership roles in the Diocese of Kerry

The volunteer Ministry of the Pastoral Leader was introduced as a response to the changing needs of parish communities. The pastoral leaders work alongside the clergy and other volunteers in their parishes and pastoral areas, co-ordinating and supporting different aspects of parish life.

Here in the Duhallow/Sliabh Luachra Pastoral Area we are greatly benefiting from the contribution of those who have already completed this training programme:

<u>Nuala Mc Cormack:</u> was already involved in many areas of ministry in Kocknagree Church, but now is broadening her ministry to many parts of the parish. She visits the housebound bringing Eucharist and other Pastoral Support. She holds Prayer Services in St Joseph's Day Care Centre and also helps in coordinating other seasonal prayer moments. Nuala is also involved in Pastoral Support to our Primary Schools.

<u>Edel Fraser:</u> works mainly in Millstreet Parish... she has a flourishing Music Ministry, is hugely involved in Pre-Sacramental Preparation, and also organises other Prayer experiences within the parish.

<u>Kathleen Dennehy</u>: works in Dromtariffe Parish, and is especially involved with the recently bereaved. She offers practical support in helping families prepare for the Requiem Mass and keeps in contact with families afterwards.

All these involvements are first steps in establishing the volunteer Ministry of the Pastoral Leader in our Pastoral Area. As each person grows in confidence they will bring that charism to other parishes, and in conjunction with the priests we will together look at ways to expand the ministry going forward.
