## The Sacrament of Confirmation

On this Tuesday February 17<sup>th</sup> two Confirmation Ceremonies will take place in the parish.

Confirmation is one of the seven sacraments of the Church. It is the sacrament in which a baptized person receives the special strength of the Holy Spirit. This strength helps them live as a faithful Christian and grow closer to God.

In Baptism, we become children of God. In Confirmation, we are strengthened to live out that faith more fully. It is like becoming a “mature” member of the Church. We choose for ourselves to follow Jesus and not just rely on the faith of our parents or family.

During the Confirmation ceremony, the bishop or priest lays hands on the person and anoints them with oil called chrism. He says, “Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.” This shows that the Holy Spirit is with them in a special way.

The Holy Spirit gives gifts such as wisdom, courage, and understanding. These gifts help us make good choices, stand up for what is right, and serve others with love.

Confirmation reminds us that we are called to share our faith, help those in need, and be witnesses of Christ in the world every day.

## The Season of Lent



We will begin the Lenten Season this coming week on Ash Wednesday February 18<sup>th</sup>.

While many look forward to this time for opportunities for spiritual growth and renewal, quite often many of us see it as a liturgical season to dread. We focus on “What am I going to give up?” “How long can I live without whatever it is I am going to give up?” “How many more days before I don’t have to give up whatever it is that I am giving up?” Who wouldn’t dread a liturgical season with such a narrow focus?
